Show Day Information

Help us avoid the morning rush check-in:

For the smooth operations of the show, the ideal would be for all exhibitors to pre-enter. In an attempt to facilitate sign-in, each secretary will have a designated function. We ask for the cooperation of all exhibitors by going into the correct line. One station will be for POST entries and another station will be for pre-entry pick-ups and additions or changes to pre-entries. There will be add/scratch class forms available and we request that they be filled out prior to coming to the office. When checking in, please have copies of rabies, coggins and breed registration papers with you **before** getting in the sign-in lines. Payment is required when registering for classes unless an open check account is in place.

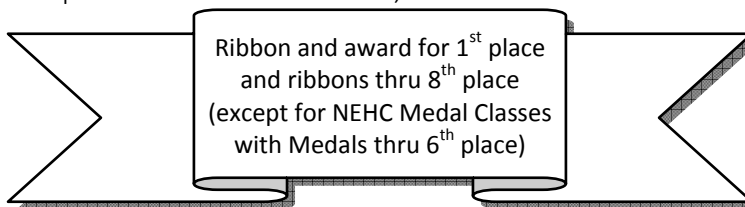
Camping for Horse Show Exhibitors/Owners:

Campsite parking is being handled by the Woodstock Fair in compliance with the Local and State Fire/Emergency codes. The Town of Woodstock Fire Marshall will strictly enforce all fire lanes. We ask for your cooperation in obeying the Fire/Emergency codes for the safety of all, and ask that campers be courteous and considerate of other campers, especially if late hours are kept. Children must be supervised and are not allowed to wander the grounds during the nighttime hours unaccompanied by an adult. Camping in the Horse Show area is without utilities and is exclusively for exhibitors/owners with stalls. Permits will be mailed to the address on the reservation. You **MUST** have your permit with you when you arrive for the Fair and it must be presented to the parking attendant. Groups of exhibitors who want to be located near each other must coordinate their arrival to be parked near each other. **NO SAVING OF SPACES.**

General Rules and Regulations

1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parent, and/or trainer to read and understand the rules contained in this book, and to read and understand the eligibility and class/division requirements and qualifications before entering any classes.
2. Classes offered herein are covered by the rules and specifications printed in this program and will be conducted and judged accordingly.
3. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide, or move classes when necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
4. The Woodstock Fair Open Horse Show Committee and the Woodstock Agricultural Society will not be held liable for injury, theft or damage to any person, property or animal. Signature on entry form constitutes agreement herein.
5. One Fair Admittance wrist band and one Fair parking pass per Horse Show exhibitor, regardless of how many horses being shown by the exhibitor.
6. Rider's age will be as of January 1, 2009.
7. The age of a horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled. It is a weanling during the calendar year of foaling date; regardless of the time of year foaled.
8. Day-end division awards are based on a Team of same horse/pony and rider (except for Breed (horse only), Equitation (rider only), & Lead Line (child only))
9. The following Point System will be used (with the exception of the NEHC Medal Classes)

1 st –	10 points
2 nd –	8 points
3 rd –	6 points
4 th –	5 points
5 th –	4 points
6 th –	3 points
7 th –	2 points
8 th –	1 points



10. **Judges' decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall approach a judge as to a decision or any other matter unless permission is obtained from the Show Superintendent. Any exhibitor or person disregarding this rule may be disqualified and forfeit all entry fees.
11. **Paperwork for all horses:** A current negative Coggins test result and current proof of veterinarian administered rabies vaccine within 12 months of show date, should accompany any pre-entry. **If not received with pre-entry, then paperwork MUST BE PRESENTED TO RECEIVE A NUMBER!** Exhibitors who are post entering must present paperwork when signing up.
12. Exhibitors must have proof of proper registration available for horses being shown in Registered Breed classes.
13. Riders must have a number presented to the judge while exhibiting in a class. The number must be on the exhibitor or on both sides of saddle pad. Exhibitors entering the ring without a number, or wearing an incorrect number, will be disqualified and no refunds will be given.
14. **2-minute gate hold** only for legitimate tack changes that are requested at the office. You must know the incoming & outgoing exhibitor numbers and the class numbers for any requests. Tack changes must be done at ringside within the view of the judge. Please plan your classes accordingly.
15. Riders are only permitted to dismount in the ring when specifically asked by the judge. Dismounting in the ring at any other time will result in disqualification from that class.
16. Bits may be checked at the discretion of the judge.
17. Cell phones, pagers, Ipods, Blackberrys or any other communication device are not allowed in the ring.
18. Headers are permitted and encouraged for Walk-Trot and Beginner riders during lineup, pinning and exit from the arena. With permission from the judge, any other rider may also use a header for assistance during line-up and pinning.
19. Schooling is permitted in authorized areas only. Courteous behavior is expected from all exhibitors. Action devices are prohibited anywhere on the show grounds.
20. All Huntseat riders 17 & under will be required to wear ASTM approved helmets with a harness whenever mounted. All exhibitors must have appropriate footwear whenever mounted. No person can ride bareback or with halter and lead lines on the Fair Grounds during the weekend. Riding double is expressly prohibited.
21. Stallions may not be shown by exhibitors 17 & under except in those Breed Classes where allowed by the rules applicable for that breed.
22. No dogs are allowed on the grounds. **PLEASE LEAVE YOUR DOGS HOME.**
23. No golf carts, motor scooters, 4-wheelers, ATVs or bikes allowed on the grounds.
24. Abusive behavior and/or foul language to any horse or any person will not be tolerated and is cause for removal from the grounds by security.
25. **Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.**

Carriage and Show Driving

1. Open to horses or ponies. Classes with over 8 entries may be divided. Drivers 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Junior-to-Drive is for exhibitors 17 and under. Ladies and Gents to Drive for exhibitors 18 and over. Cross-entry is not allowed.
2. Although unrecognized, this show will be guided by the current applicable rules of the American Driving Society.
3. **Removal of the bridle while the horse/pony is between the shafts means instant elimination.**
4. The harness and vehicle must be in safe condition. Bridles must have a noseband or cavesson. All horses must be serviceably sound. Any turnout deemed unsafe for any reason will be barred from competition.
5. For **Carriage Driving** - over-checks are not acceptable (per ADS rules).
6. Burrs, gags and twisted wire bits are **not** acceptable.
7. **Show Driving** - is for "show-type" horses - must use a two wheel, wire-wheeled cart and an over-check or side-check bridle - brilliance and animation are not to be penalized. Horses may not cross enter into Carriage Driving Classes. Whip and gloves are required.
8. **Carriage Driving** - is for "carriage-type" horses - must be shown to a safe 2 or 4 wheel cart (wire wheels and pneumatic tires are acceptable) and either no-check or loose side-check bridle. Classes are for pleasure horses with low ground-covering gaits. Apron, hat, gloves and whip in hand are required. Horses may not cross enter into Show Pleasure Driving Classes.

Reinsmanship - Judged primarily on the skill of the driver. To be judged: 75% on handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall appearance; 25% on fit and appropriateness of harness, vehicle and attire.

Working Pleasure - A pleasure driving class judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire.

Turnout - A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire; 15% on overall impression.

Ride & Drive - A pleasure class judged 50% on driving and 50% on riding. The same exhibitor must ride and drive the horse/pony. Any style of riding is permitted.

Youth/ Adult Tag Team Showmanship!

The youth will do a pattern and hand off the horse/pony for an adult to do a pattern.

Showmanship: These classes are open to horses/ponies. Each class will have a different pattern. They are judged strictly on the exhibitors' ability to show a horse or pony in halter/bridle. The horse or pony is merely a prop to demonstrate the ability of the exhibitor. The ideal showmanship performance consists of a poised, confident, neatly attired exhibitor leading a well-groomed horse that quickly and efficiently performs the requested pattern with promptness, smoothness and precision. Patterns will be posted prior to the start of the class.

Gymkhana Divisions

Personal Appointments: Western-type long sleeved shirt, western pants or blue jeans, western-type hat or ASTM approved helmet with harness; hard boots with heels are all required. Chaps and/or spurs are optional. English attire for Walk-Trot Division only.

Tack: Western-style saddle and headstall (tapaderos prohibited). The following are allowed: bosal and/or hackamore, nosebands, martingales (English Walk-Trot riders ONLY) and/or tie-downs, protective leg bandages or boots, riding bats. All bits must have a curb strap.

Timing: To be done by electric timer. Failure of electrical device would result in one person taking time by stopwatch. Timer located at the start/finish line.

Restrictions/Disqualification: Excessive use of whip/bat or spurs on any horse or pony in or out of ring, not following the pattern, fall of horse and/or rider, spurring or whipping in front of the girth, unsoundness of horse or pony in or out of the ring. You must cross the starting line within two(2) minutes after your number is called to ride or you will be disqualified.

Start/Finish: All starts and finishes will be in the ring with the gate closed.

Walk-Trot Gymkhana Division: Open to horses and ponies. Open to Walk-Trot riders of any age who have not competed at any show, in any class, requiring a canter. Riders may only cross enter into other Walk-Trot classes. **Open to any discipline. Riders must use appropriate tack/attire for their discipline.**

Look What's New This Year

NEHC (New England Horsemen's Council) Qualifying Western/Reining Seat Medal Classes for Juniors and Adults for the Medal Finals to be held at Eastern States Expo Center on October 23rd & 24th, 2009

The Western riding pattern is on page 33 of the NEHC rulebook, or the rulebook can be viewed online and printed at www.nehc.info For questions about these classes, click "Medal Information" on the NEHC homepage for a list of contacts. NEHC membership forms will be available at the show to sign up that day or are online anytime. Competitors may qualify up to 14 days before the published NEHC date of the finals. All exhibitors must present a valid membership card before the class, and show secretaries must record this number. To fill the class, three competitors must show with proper attire. A first place win qualifies you for the finals. A total of 10 points qualifies you for the finals. Once you qualify for the finals, you are no longer eligible to compete in that section of Medal Classes. Points: 1st-10, 2nd-6, 3rd-4, 4th-2, 5th-1, 6th- 1/2

The Class Entry Fee for these classes is \$20.00

Class 80, 160 – NEHC Junior Western/Reining Seat Medal Class ~ Open to Junior Members of the New England Horsemen's Council who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. Riders shall be judged on seat, hands, performance of horse, appointments of horse and rider and suitability of horse to rider. Horses are to enter the ring at a walk and will be judged at a walk, jog and lope. They shall be worked both ways of the ring and must be on the correct lead. After being worked in a group, the judge may ask for each horse to work individually. Horses are required to back.

Class 81, 161 – NEHC Adult Western/Reining Seat Medal Class ~ Open to all Adult Amateur Members of the New England Horsemen's Council. All specifications same as the Junior Western/Reining Seat Medal Class (above).

Tack: Hunt-type saddle, hunter-type headstall with appropriate nose cavesson. No discrimination against any standard English bit. Hackamore and/or bosals are prohibited. A chain chinstrap must be of standard flat variety. Judge may ask for removal/alteration of any bit deemed unfair/inhumane. Breastplate or cruppers are optional. Standing martingales are allowed in over fence classes only. Draw reins and/or dropped nosebands are prohibited. Bandages and/or boots on horse's legs are permitted in equitation classes only.

Elimination: The following will result in elimination from a class: unsoundness of horse, jumping an obstacle before it is reset, bolting from the ring, off course, fall of horse or rider, or three refusals.

Personal Appointments: Long-sleeved western-style shirt or appropriate blouse or long-sleeve shirt with collar, band, stand-up or tuxedo-style, appropriate jeans, trousers, pants, Western hat or approved ASTM helmet with harness. Boots with heel are required. Western-type chaps are optional. Spurs are optional.

Tack: Stock-type saddle required. Any lariat, riata or hobbles are optional. Covered stirrups are prohibited. Western-type headstall required. Cavesson-type nosebands are prohibited. No discrimination against any standard western bit (i.e. curb-type with shanks, solid or broken mouthpiece). Horses five years and under using a ring snaffle bit or bosal/hackamore may be ridden with two hands. Horses six years and over must be ridden with one hand in a shank-type bit. Mechanical hackamores are prohibited. Bosals are allowed as appropriate to breed and age of horse. Curb strap or chain chin strap must be at least ½" in width and be of the standard flat variety. No wire or metal other than approved type curb chains allowed. Rounded, rolled, braided or rawhide curb straps are prohibited. Reins may be of split leather variety or romal reins. Breastplate is optional. Nosebands, martingales, tie-downs or draw reins are prohibited. Bandages and/or boots of any type are prohibited.
