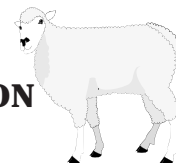

ALL SHEEP MUST HAVE A SCRAPIE TAG AND RABIES VACCINATION



REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING:

1. PREREGISTER by mail BEFORE Saturday, August 14, 2010.
2. You MUST PREREGISTER up to the limit of 2 animals per lot.
3. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER AUGUST 14, 2010. **ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS**
4. Only TWO ENTRIES per exhibitor in any single lot. Only ONE ENTRY per exhibitor in group lots. No more than 4 Ram Lambs and 4 Ewe Lambs may be shown. Regional Show check Regional Classes.
5. Breaking dates for lambs will be: Senior: Sept., Oct., Nov., Intermediate: Dec., Jan., Junior: Feb. and after.
Flocks will consist of a ram, 2 yearling ewes and 2 ewe lambs.
6. Any animal or group of animals NOT PREREGISTERED WILL NOT BE ALLOWED to participate. NO EXCEPTIONS.
7. You MUST list Department number, Class letter and Lot number for each entry.
8. If you have department specific questions, please contact one of the superintendents listed above. For additions or corrections to entries, please contact the Superintendent of Entries at (860)928-3246 ext. 104.
9. All sheep MUST have a RABIES VACCINATION 30 days before show date and have a certificate signed and dated by a veterinarian.
10. Registration and health papers will be checked by the Sheep Superintendents upon arrival. Acceptance or rejection of sheep upon arrival will be left up to the discretion of the Superintendent and / or Health Officials.
12. Any sheep, including wool breeds, not properly cleaned or fitted for show will be rejected at the discretion of the Superintendent.
13. All sheep MUST have an official health certificate issued by the state of origin and must call 860-713-2504 for CT permit number.
14. Purebreds MUST have a registration certificate and ear tags in sheep's ear that match.
15. Premiums will be paid by mail before September 30, 2010.
16. If for any reason you cannot attend after registering, you MUST notify the Superintendent in order to be eligible for the following year.
17. Release times will be at the discretion of the Sheep Superintendent.
18. STRAIGHT JUDGING IN ALL CLASSES. All judging results are final.

LEADLINE CLASS WILL BE HELD ON SATURDAY EVENING 6:00 PM SHARP

Contestants **MUST** have shown an interest in sheep and entrants **MUST** have 50% of their garment made of 100% wool. Garments should be appropriate, attractive and lend elegance to the class. If possible, the sheep attire should match the person leading it. The sheep **MUST** be over 6 months of age, conditioned, fitted and trained to show in halter. No coloring of animals. Sheep should be presented in the most attractive manner possible. The contestant and sheep should enhance each other.

A TYPED SUMMARY, IN SHORT STORY FORM, IS REQUIRED 48 HOURS PRIOR to the Lead Line Contest. The summary should contain the contestant's name, address, age, school attending, hobbies, a brief biography of interest, breed of sheep being led and detailed description of the garment the contestant will be wearing.
