REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING:

1. PREREGISTER by mail BEFORE Saturday, August 14, 2010.
2. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PREREGISTERED. NO EXCEPTIONS.
3. Read carefully the RULES FOR ENTERING on the back of the General Entry Form.
4. In any LOT, an exhibitor may place only one entry, except in Lots 36, 46 and 72 which are unlimited.
5. Glass containers MUST be used to hold specimen to prevent tipping.
6. A collection consists of not fewer than 5 and not more than 10 stems, (unless otherwise stated.)
7. Specimen entered in competition MUST be disease free and without insect damage.
8. All flowers MUST be grown by exhibitor. "Amateur only". Nothing grown in a commercial garden is allowed.
9. NO ARTIFICIAL OR SILK FLOWERS may be used in any of the classes. NO EXCEPTIONS.
10. You MUST list the Department number, Class letter and Lot number for each item entered on entry blank.
11. Bring all preregistered entries to the fairgrounds on Receiving Day, Thursday, September 2, between 10:00 AM and 7:00 PM. Enter at the North Gate only.
12. For department specific questions, please contact the superintendents listed above. For additions or corrections to entries, please contact the Superintendent of Entries at (860)928-3246 ext. 104.
13. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE REMOVED AT DESIGNATED TIMES ONLY: NO VEHICLES on grounds before 9:00 PM Monday. NO EXCEPTIONS.

14. Any item not picked up by 7:00 PM on Tuesday will become the property of the Woodstock Fair and will be disposed of accordingly.
15. Premiums will be paid by mail before September 30, 2010.
16. JUDGING WILL BE DONE BY THE DANISH SYSTEM (except when otherwise stated.) All judging results are final.
