## REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING:

1. **PREREGISTER** by mail **BEFORE Saturday, August 14, 2010.**
2. **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PREREGISTERED. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
3. Read carefully the **RULES FOR ENTERING** on the back of the **Junior Entry Blank**. Entries **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED** if rules are not followed. Effort on an entry should reflect the grade level of the child in order to be judged.
4. **No live animals**, hobbies, collections, Legos, kits or coloring book pages.
5. Food and Vegetable entries **MUST** be on disposable plates. **No commercial mixes** allowed.
6. All entries **MUST** be made or grown **SOLELY BY THE CHILD.**
7. Nature work **MUST** be collected and arranged **SOLELY BY THE CHILD.**
8. **ENTER BY GRADE JUST COMPLETED.**
9. Due to space limitations, unusually large crafts may not be accepted.
10. No unfinished or soiled article is eligible for a prize.
11. All articles **MUST** have been completed within the last year.
12. Only **ONE ENTRY** is allowed in **EACH LOT.**
13. Kindergarten and younger may enter **6 items total.**  
This includes Classes: U, V, W, and X.
14. Grades 1 through 8 may enter **8 items total.**  
This includes Classes: U, V, W, X, and Y the State Baking Contest.
15. You **MUST** list the **Department number, Class letter** and **Lot number** for each item entered on the entry blank.

#### "Almond Glazed Sugar Cookies"

1 cup butter, softened  
3/4 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon almond extract  
2 cups all-purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder  
1/4 teaspoon salt

#### Glaze:

1 1/2 cups powdered sugar  
1 teaspoon almond extract  
4-5 teaspoons water  
sliced almonds

**PREHEAT** oven to 400 degrees.

Combine butter, sugar and almond extract in a large mixer bowl. Beat at medium speed, scraping bowl often, until creamy (1-2 minutes). Reduce speed to low; add all remaining cookie ingredients. Beat until well mixed (1-2 minutes).

Roll dough into 1 inch balls; place 2 inches apart on cookie sheet. Flatten balls to 1/4 inch thickness with bottom of buttered glass dipped in sugar.

Bake for 7-9 minutes or until edges are very lightly browned. Cool 1 minute; remove from cookie sheet. Cool completely.

Stir together all glaze ingredients in a small bowl, with a wire whisk. Decorate cooled cookies with glaze and sliced almonds. Glaze sets up quickly so frost and decorate only a few cookies at a time. Makes 3 1/2 dozen cookies.
