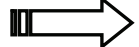

Show Day Check In Information

For the smooth operations of the show, check-in procedures have been streamlined. We ask for the cooperation of all exhibitors. If you have pre-entered with all the required paperwork and fees, proceed to the new Exhibitor Center building. If you pre-entered and have been notified of any missing paperwork, fees or any other information needed, proceed to the Secretary Windows in the Office building. If you are POST entering, proceed to the Secretary Windows in the Office building and please have copies of rabies, coggins and breed registration papers with your completed entry form **before** getting in the sign-in line. Payment is required when registering for classes unless a signed open check account is in place. There will be add/scratch class forms available and we request that they be filled out prior to coming to either of the two buildings. Exhibitor parking sticker and wrist band are to be picked up in the building where you picked up your exhibitor number.

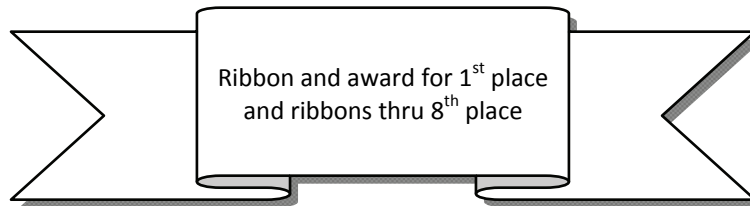

General Rules and Regulations

1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, parent, and/or trainer **to read and understand** the rules contained in this book, and to read and understand the eligibility and class/division requirements and qualifications before entering any classes.
2. Classes offered herein are covered by the rules and specifications printed in this program and will be conducted and judged accordingly.
3. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, divide, or move classes when necessary to facilitate the smooth running of the show.
4. The Woodstock Fair Horse Show Staff and the Woodstock Agricultural Society, Inc. will not be held liable for injury, theft or damage to any person, property or animal. Signature on entry form constitutes agreement herein.
5. One Fair Admittance wrist band and one parking pass per Horse Show exhibitor, regardless of how many horses being shown.
6. Rider's age will be as of January 1, 2011.
7. The age of a horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled. It is a weanling during the calendar year of foaling date; regardless of the time of year foaled.
8. Day-end division awards are based on a Team of same horse and rider (except for Breed (horse only), Equitation & Lead Line (rider only)
9. The following Point System will be used (with the exception of the NEHC Medal Classes)

1 st	-	10 points
2 nd	-	8 points
3 rd	-	6 points
4 th	-	5 points
5 th	-	4 points
6 th	-	3 points
7 th	-	2 points
8 th	-	1 points



10. **Judges' decisions are final.** No exhibitor or person shall approach a judge for any reason unless permission is obtained from the Horse Show Supervisor and the judge is agreeable. Any exhibitor or representative of an exhibitor disregarding this rule will cause the disqualification of the exhibitor, the forfeiture of all entry fees, and may be asked to leave the area if disregard of the rule continues.
11. **Paperwork for all horses:** A current negative Coggins test result and current proof of veterinarian administered rabies vaccine within 12 months of show date, should accompany any pre-entry. **If not received with pre-entry, then paperwork MUST BE PRESENTED TO RECEIVE A NUMBER!** Exhibitors who are post entering must present paperwork when signing up.
12. Exhibitors must have proof of proper registration for horses being shown in Registered Breed classes.
13. Riders must have a number presented to the judge while exhibiting in a class. The number must be on the exhibitor's back or on both sides of saddle pad. Exhibitors entering the ring without a number or wearing an incorrect number will be disqualified and no refunds will be given.
14. **2-minute gate hold only** for legitimate tack changes that are requested at the office. PLEASE DO NOT ASK GATE KEEPERS FOR CLASS HOLDS. You must know the incoming & outgoing exhibitor numbers and the class numbers for any requests. Tack changes must be done at ringside within the view of the judge. Please plan your classes accordingly.
15. Riders are only permitted to dismount in the ring when specifically asked by the judge. Dismounting in the ring at any other time will result in disqualification from that class.
16. Bits may be checked at the discretion of the judge.
17. Cell phones, iPods, BlackBerrys or any other communication device are not allowed in the ring.
18. Headers are permitted and encouraged for Walk-Trot and Beginner exhibitors during the lineup, pinning and exit from the arena. With permission from the judge, any other rider may also use a header for assistance during line-up and pinning.
19. Side walkers are permitted and encouraged for exhibitors in Lead Line age 4 and under classes.
20. Schooling of horses is permitted in authorized areas and times only. No schooling of horses near the barns, spectator areas, or concession area. Courteous behavior is expected from all exhibitors. Action devices are prohibited anywhere on the show grounds.
21. All Huntseat riders 17 & under will be required to wear ASTM approved helmets with a harness whenever mounted. All exhibitors must have appropriate footwear whenever mounted. No person can ride bareback or with halter and lead lines on the Fair Grounds during the weekend. Riding double is expressly prohibited.
22. Stallions may not be shown by exhibitors 17 & under except in those Breed Classes where allowed by the rules applicable for that breed.
23. No dogs are allowed on the horse show grounds. **PLEASE LEAVE YOUR DOGS HOME.**
24. No recreational golf carts, motor scooters, 4-wheelers, ATVs or bikes allowed on the grounds.
25. Abusive behavior and/or foul language to any horse or person will not be tolerated and is cause for removal from the grounds by security.
26. **Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on the premises.**

Some Stabling Information

1. Names and stall number assignments will be posted at the show. Any exhibitor using an unassigned stall, or one assigned to another exhibitor, or tampering with the stall assignments, will be charged a \$125.00 stall fee and asked to vacate the stall. No person shall enter any stall other than their own without the express permission of the owner
2. No mounting or riding of horses in the tent aisles or stalls. No use of whips in the stalls or aisles. Abuse of horses will not be tolerated.
3. No smoking is allowed in the tents or stalls. No grilling or open fires are permitted anywhere in or around the tents and stalls.
4. Do not overload the electrical outlets or use extension cords in an unsafe manner.
5. Hosing/washing of horses must be done in the wash area. Do NOT bathe horses near the wooden stalls.
6. You must clean up after your horse and dispose of waste in designated areas.

Writers of returned checks will be charged a \$25.00 fee.

Exhibitor(s) and horse(s) covered by a returned check will not be allowed to show until all debts are paid.

Pre-entries must be postmarked no later than Wednesday August 24, 2011. Entries postmarked after this date will be considered a Post Entry and will be charged a post-entry fee of \$15.00. Payment or a signed open check made payable to *Woodstock Fair Horse Show* must accompany pre-entries or a \$15.00 fee will be added. No telephone or fax entries. No refunds will be made at the show. All refunds will be mailed. Refunds will only be made upon postmark, *within 3 days* after the end of the show, of a vet certificate, or a physician's certificate in the case of the rider. **No refunds will be issued for any reason whatsoever for stalls.**

- **Stall Fees:** \$125.00 for the weekend if postmarked on or before August 18, 2011. **Stalls are non-refundable for any reason.** Bedding is available for purchase. Stalls are available on Thursday after 9:00AM and must be vacated on Monday. Please check in your arrival and check out your departure with the Barn Manager. We ask that you leave your stalls clean with manure deposited in the proper area. All horse trailers not in use will be parked in a designated area. All horses must be stabled after show hours. No temporary paddocks are allowed.
- **Camping** – All camping is being handled by the parking department of the Fair. The Fair camping form, its rules and fees is included in this program for your convenience. The horse show has no involvement, so for any questions about camping, please call the main office: (860) 928-3246. **RESERVE CAMPING EARLY and be sure to include an email in order to receive confirmation information.**

High Point Week-End Awards

The **High Point Exhibitor** awards are based on the **total** points earned by an exhibitor in **all** classes entered. This is not a team award and all classes count; regardless of how many horses/ponies an exhibitor may ride/drive/exhibit. Exhibitors need not be present at the time of the presentation to win these awards.

Open to any age Walk-Trot exhibitors. This class will be run in three sections - hunt, western and gymkhana. Exact class specifications will be announced before the class starts. The first two sections will be western/gymkhana, followed by a timed 3 minute break to prepare for proper tack and attire change for the hunt section. Grooms are to be ready at the gate.

Carriage and Show Driving Divisions

1. Open to horses or ponies. Classes with over 8 entries may be divided. Drivers 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Junior-to-Drive is for exhibitors 17 and under. Ladies and Gents to Drive for exhibitors 18 and over. Cross-entry is not allowed.
2. Although unrecognized, this show will be guided by the current applicable rules of the American Driving Society.
3. **Removal of the bridle while the horse/pony is between the shafts means instant elimination.**
4. The harness and vehicle must be in safe condition. Bridles must have a noseband or cavesson. All horses must be serviceably sound. Any turnout deemed unsafe for any reason will be barred from competition.
5. For **Carriage Driving - over-checks** are not acceptable (per ADS rules).
6. Burrs, gags and twisted wire bits are **not** acceptable.
7. **Show Driving** - is for "show-type" horses - must use a two wheel, wire-wheeled cart and an over-check or side-check bridle - brilliance and animation are not to be penalized. Horses may not cross enter into Carriage Driving Classes. Whip and gloves are required.
8. **Carriage Driving** - is for "carriage-type" horses - must be shown to a safe 2 or 4 wheel cart (wire wheels and pneumatic tires are acceptable) and either no-check or loose side-check bridle. Classes are for pleasure horses with low ground-covering gaits. Apron, hat, gloves and whip in hand are required. Horses may not cross enter into Show Pleasure Driving Classes.

Reinsmanship - Judged primarily on the skill of the driver. To be judged: 75% on handling of the reins and whip, control, posture, and overall appearance; 25% on fit and appropriateness of harness, vehicle and attire.

Working Pleasure - A pleasure driving class judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire.

Turnout - A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be judged 40% on performance, manners and way of going; 30% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 15% on neatness and appropriateness of attire; 15% on overall impression.

Carriage Driving Division: Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 7

Show Pleasure Driving Division: Classes 5, 6, 8

Showmanship Classes

These classes are open to horses/ponies. Each class will have a different pattern. They are judged strictly on the exhibitors' ability to show a horse or pony in halter/bridle. The horse or pony is merely a prop to demonstrate the ability of the exhibitor. The ideal showmanship performance consists of a poised, confident, neatly attired exhibitor leading a well-groomed horse that quickly and efficiently performs the requested pattern with promptness, smoothness and precision. Patterns will be posted prior to the start of the class. Neat, appropriate attire is required.

Gymkhana Divisions

Personal Appointments: Western-type long sleeved shirt, western pants or blue jeans, western-type hat or ASTM approved helmet with harness; hard boots with heels are all required. Chaps and/or spurs are optional. English attire for Walk-Trot Division only.

Tack: Western-style saddle and headstall (tapaderos prohibited). The following are allowed: bosal and/or hackamore, nosebands, martingales (English Walk-Trot riders ONLY) and/or tie-downs, protective leg bandages or boots, riding bats. All bits must have a curb strap.

Timing: To be done by electric timer. Failure of electrical device would result in one person taking time by stopwatch. Timer located at the start/finish line.

Restrictions/Disqualification: Excessive use of whip/bat or spurs on any horse or pony in or out of ring, not following the pattern, fall of horse and/or rider, spurring or whipping in front of the girth, unsoundness of horse or pony in or out of the ring. You must cross the starting line within two(2) minutes after your number is called to ride or you will be disqualified.

Start/Finish: All starts and finishes will be in the ring with the gate closed.

Walk-Trot Gymkhana Division: Open to horses and ponies. Open to **Walk-Trot** riders of any age who have not competed at any show, in any class, requiring a canter. Riders may only cross enter into other Walk-Trot classes. **Open to any discipline. Riders must use appropriate tack/attire for their discipline.**

Youth Gymkhana Division: Open to horses/ponies. Open to riders 17 & under.

LOOK ! Trail Division

The trail classes will be run one after another in succession with an "order of go" at the gate. Each class will be finished after the order of go is complete. Once the first rider in a class is on course, the class is closed and no additional entries are allowed. After the last rider in a class finishes their course, the judge will pin the class, and the next trail class will begin.

Trail Division: All classes in this Division will require a walk and trot only. These classes are open to horses & ponies and riders of any age and any discipline. Trail course patterns will be posted at the trail ring and available for handout at the Exhibitor Center.

Hunter Divisions

Personal Appointments: Riders 17 and under must always wear an ASTM approved helmet with a harness when mounted. Riders 18 and over must wear an ASTM approved helmet with a harness when jumping. Suitable blouse or shirts to be worn under hunt jacket. Removal of jackets is at the discretion of the judge. Breeches or jodhpurs, riding boots with heel are required. Chaps are not allowed. Spurs are optional and must be of unrowelled type. Crops or bats are optional.

Tack: Hunt-type saddle, hunter-type headstall with appropriate nose cavesson. No discrimination against any standard English bit. Hackamore and/or bosals are prohibited. A chain chinstrap must be of standard flat variety. Judge may ask for removal/alteration of any bit deemed unfair/inhumane. Breastplate or cruppers are optional. Standing martingales are allowed in over fence classes only. Draw reins and/or dropped nosebands are prohibited. Bandages and/or boots on horse's legs are permitted in equitation classes only.

Elimination: The following will result in elimination from a class: unsoundness of horse, jumping an obstacle before it is reset, bolting from the ring, off course, fall of horse or rider, or three refusals.

Hunter-Type Walk-Trot: Open to riders of all ages. Rider must not have competed in any class requiring a canter at this or any previous show. **Riders are not to canter.**

Breastplate is optional. Nosebands, martingales, tie-downs or draw reins are prohibited. Bandages and/or boots are prohibited.
