Requirements for Entering:

1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all **Fair Rules and Regulations**, located on page 2, for participation in the Woodstock Fair.
2. Only one entry is allowed in each lot.
3. Enter by grade **just completed**. Effort on an entry should reflect the grade level of the child in order to be judged.
4. High school-age exhibitors are encouraged to enter in the adult departments.
5. Kindergarten and younger may enter **6 items total**. This includes classes U, V, W, and X.
6. Grades 1 through 8 may enter **8 items total**. This includes classes U, V, W, X, and Y the State Baking Contest.
7. All articles must have been completed within the last year.
8. Due to space limitations, unusually large crafts may not be accepted.
9. All entries must be made or grown solely by the child.
10. Nature work must be collected and arranged solely by the child.
11. Food and vegetable entries must be on disposable plates. No commercial mixes allowed.
12. No live animals, hobbies, collections, Legos, kits or coloring book pages.
13. Any unfinished or soiled article will not be accepted for judging.
14. Judging will be by the Danish System, with the exception of classes U, V, W, X and Y.

Cookies & Cream Brownies



- 1 - 8 oz. package 1/3 less fat cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 cup + 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 ¼ cups liquid egg substitute such as Egg Beaters
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 8 reduced-fat chocolate Oreo cookies, chopped
- 1/2 cup butter
- 6 oz. unsweetened chocolate, chopped
- 1 package, (5 oz.) pureed prune baby food
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350° F. Line a 9" baking pan with enough foil to overhang sides by 2"; coat with cooking spray.

On medium-high speed, beat cream cheese and 2 tablespoons sugar until light and fluffy, 1-2 minutes. Beat in 1/4 cup egg substitute and vanilla. Stir in cookies; reserve.

In pot, melt butter and chocolate over medium heat. Remove from heat; stir in remaining 1 cup sugar until blended, then remaining egg substitute and baby food. Stir in flour, baking powder and salt until combined.

Spread 1/2 of chocolate layer in pan. Drop 1/2 of cream cheese batter by tablespoonfuls over chocolate. Repeat with remaining batters.

Bake 50-55 minutes or until toothpick inserted comes out with moist crumbs. Cool 20 minutes. Using foil, lift brownie from pan, cool completely on rack.

Cut into squares. Submit 8 squares for judging; enjoy the rest.
