Requirements for Entering:

1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all **Fair Rules and Regulations**, located on page 3, for participation in the Woodstock Fair.
2. Exhibitors must read and comply with the **Connecticut Fair and Show Requirements** located on page 4 and the **Memorandum** located on page 5, set forth by the State of Connecticut Department of Agriculture which will be strictly observed.
3. Registration and health papers will be verified by the sheep superintendents upon arrival. Acceptance or rejection of sheep will be at the discretion of the superintendents and/or health officials.
4. Papers may be checked at any time. Will be checked in all bred and owned classes.
5. Purebreds must have a registration certificate and ear tags in sheep's ear that match. Scrapie tags in ears and scrapie tag numbers on health papers are required.
6. Any sheep, including wool breeds, not properly cleaned or fitted for show will be rejected at the discretion of the superintendents.
7. Exhibitors may register up to the limit of 2 animals per lot.
8. Only two entries per exhibitor in any single lot. Only one entry per exhibitor in group lots. No more than 4 Ram Lambs and 4 Ewe Lambs may be shown. Regional Show check Regional Classes.
9. Breaking dates for lambs will be: Senior - Sept., Oct. and Nov. Intermediate - Dec., Jan. and Junior - Feb. and after.
10. Flocks will consist of a ram, 2 yearling ewes and 2 ewe lambs.
11. **Sheep must be penned by 9:00 am Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday.** There is **no** early arrival on Thursday.
12. Release times will be at the discretion of the sheep superintendents.
13. If for any reason the exhibitor cannot attend after registering, he/she is required to notify the sheep superintendents in order to be eligible for the following year's fair.
14. Straight judging in all classes.

Saturday, August 12, 2017.

Exhibitors must have shown an interest in sheep and must have 50% of their garment made of 100% wool. Garments should be appropriate, attractive and lend elegance to the class. If possible, the sheep attire should match the person leading it. The sheep must be over 6 months of age, conditioned, fitted and trained to show in halter. No coloring of animals. Sheep should be presented in the most attractive manner possible. The exhibitor and sheep should enhance each other.

Using the Leadline Narration Form located on page 48, submit a typed summary, in short story form, a minimum of 48 hours prior to the Lead Line Contest. The summary should contain the exhibitor's name, address, age, school attending, hobbies, a brief biography of interest, breed of sheep being led and detailed description of the garment the exhibitor will be wearing.

Requirements for Entering:

1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all "Requirements for Entering" in Department 9 - Sheep.
2. Youth exhibitors:
 - a) Youth show is open to any exhibitor between the ages of 5 years and 21 years. Ages as of September 1, 2017.
 - b) Sheep must be owned a minimum of 30 days prior to the show.
 - c) Mandatory dress code: white shirt and khaki, dark green or white trousers. Jeans in good repair only; no shorts.
 - d) Youth exhibitors must show his/her own sheep in each class. If the youth exhibitor has more than one sheep, another youth may help him/her show.
 - e) Papers for flock classes must be presented in the ring.
 - f) **All sheep must be penned by 9:00 am on Saturday, Sept. 2nd.** Entrance at the North Gate only.
 - g) Judging will start at 9:30 am, Saturday, Sept. 2nd. Release times will be at the discretion of the superintendents on Saturday evening.
 - h) Judging will be by the Danish System.
