

DEPARTMENT 17 - HANDWORK

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Requirements for Entering:

1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all **Fair Rules and Regulations**, located on page 3, for participation in the Woodstock Fair.
2. A maximum of 11 finished articles, plus one additional article for the special contest, will be accepted per exhibitor.
3. A maximum of 6 articles per lot within a class will be accepted. One class per item, determined by exhibitor.
4. Classes A thru I must be crafted by hand (without machine, with the exception of Class B, Lot 24) completely by the exhibitor. No work is to be finished by someone else.
5. All articles must have been completed within the last year.
6. Visible names or labels must be covered.
7. Framed entries must be ready for hanging on a sturdy hanger with wire; no clips. No exceptions.
8. In needlework classes, the area of stitched work is measured.
9. Due to space limitations, large items may be restricted.
10. Judging will be by the Danish System, except where otherwise stated.

Please note: Department 17, Classes SC - L, is open to amateur exhibitors only, exhibitors who craft for pleasure, not resale. Exhibitors who sell their crafts are not eligible to enter in Classes SC - L.

Professional Exhibitors may enter any handwork in Class M: Professional

CLASS A HANDICRAFT

Hooked Article: Loops of yarn/fabric are pulled through a backing using a crochet hook like tool.

Latch Hooked Article: Short, pre-cut strips of yarn/fabric are knotted to a backing using a hinged hook.

STATE QUILT CONTEST Association of Connecticut Fairs

Sponsored by
The Association of Connecticut Fairs and
The Durham Agricultural Fair Association, Inc., "The Durham Fair"

Who May Enter: This contest is open to all residents of Connecticut; men, women and juniors. If entered by juniors, they will be judged with all adult entries.

How to Enter: Any quilt that is entered at any participating fair that is a member of the Association of Connecticut Fairs is automatically competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter the contest at as many member fairs as they wish until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair in the state contest. The state contest is held on the day of the Fall Awards Banquet of the Association of Connecticut Fairs.

Judging: The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges' score sheets to each fair. The contestants will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Judging will be based on overall appearance, workmanship and originality. Decisions of the judges are final.

Local Contest: The winner of the quilt contest will receive a blue ribbon from the Association of Connecticut Fairs and will become eligible to submit their entry to the state contest. In the event a fair only receives one entry in the contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, the Association rosette must be awarded to that entry.

State Contest: The state contest will be held on the day of the Fall Awards Banquet of the Association of Connecticut Fairs (check www.ctagfairs.org for date and location). Each fair must contact the winner of their local contest and provide information about reservations and other contest info. The Association of Connecticut Fairs does not contact the contestants. One reservation for the winning exhibitor will be made compliments of the Woodstock Agricultural Society, Inc. Additional reservations will be at the exhibitor's expense.

The following prizes will be awarded in each category:

1st Prize: 50.00 **2nd Prize:** 35.00 **3rd Prize:** 15.00

Categories:

1. Hand-Appliqué
2. Patchwork - Machine Quilted
3. Patchwork - Hand Quilted

Quilted Contest Rules:

1. All work must be completed by an individual quilt maker.
2. Work can be pieced by hand or by machine but appliqué must be done by hand.
3. Quilts may be hand or machine quilted, no hand tied quilts.
4. Appliqué quilts must consist of at least 50% appliqué.
5. Quilt perimeter must measure a minimum of 216 inches total.
6. Quilts may not be made from pre-cut quilt kits.
7. No wall hanging quilts.
8. A quilt can only compete in the Association of Connecticut Fairs Quilt Contest once.



CLASS K QUILTING

Exhibitor must do all work, including quilting. No pre-quilted material.

Lots 83, 84, 85, and 86 may be eligible for the State Quilt Contest.

Quilters Please Note: A quilt is a covering made from 2 layers of fabric, one layer of which is either pieced or appliqué, and held in place by stitched designs or ties, with batting material between the layers.

CLASS L HAND SPINNING

Lots 92-95 must be a minimum of 1 1/2 yards, weigh at least 2 ounces and be tied in 4 places. Fiber content, ply and use of a drop spindle must be noted on a card attached to item.
